| | <p>5 important events/moments.</p> <p>1. LRRH is asked by her mom to take a basket of goodies to Gran.</p> | <p>Explain why each plot event seems important.</p> <p>Inciting Incident.</p> | |
| | <p>2. LRRH wanders off the path, distracted by pretty (like her) WILD flowers.</p> | | |
| | <p>3. BBW approaches LRRH, pumps her for information. She is too innocent, and answers them!</p> | <p>She gives the BBW too much information.</p> | |
